



Annual Dewitt C. Alfred, Jr., MD Psychiatric Research Symposium

The Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences hosted its Annual Dewitt C. Alfred, Jr., MD Psychiatric Research Symposium under the leadership of Dr. John Gaston and co-chairs of the planning committee Dr. Kisha Holden and Dr. Brian McGregor. The event took place in the President's Board Room of the National Center for Primary Care building on Wednesday April 26, 2017. This symposium is held in honor of Dewitt C. Alfred, Jr., MD, the founding Chair of the Department of Psychiatry at Morehouse School of Medicine and Venessa L. Tatum, MD, a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist and Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at Morehouse School of Medicine. The event had about 50 participants this year. The keynote speaker, Yolanda Graham, Medical Director, at Devereux Advanced Behavioral Health in Kennesaw enlightened the audience as she lectured on "Research, Advocacy, Policy: Strategies to Strengthen Behavioral Health for Youth and Families".
